elcome to the 2021-2022 Valentine Theatre Annual Report

It's Great to be Back!

After 18 months of being shuttered because of the COVID-19 pandemic, it was thrilling to once again welcome patrons and community arts partners back home to the Valentine! This season we were off and running in September with an original production by Toledo Ballet followed quickly by Toledo Opera's stunning performances of "II Travatore," featuring soprano Leah Crocetto of the Metropolitan Opera. We opened our Broadway Series in November with the 25th Anniversary Farewell Tour of "Rent." With sold-out and nearly sold-out performances by the Midtwon Men, "South Pacific," "Beautiful," starring Toledo's own Sara Shepard, and "Jersey Boys," this season proved to be one of our best, both financially and artistically. We are so thankful to our patrons and sponsors who helped the Valentine stay strong during the dark months of the pandemic. It's great to see patrons milling about our lobbies and sitting in our theatre once again!

Some more highlights from this season included a terrific encore performance by Grammy-nominated "Black Violin" featuring Wil B on viola and Kev Marcus on violin. The duo, who first performed here in 2019, sold out well in advance and had patrons up on their feet dancing for the entire concert! Another highly anticipated return engagement was The Ten Tenors from Australia. Unfortunately, two of the tenors tested positive for COVID just before showtime, so it ended up being The Eight Tenors instead! A career-first for them. Fortunately, our patrons were completely understanding and loved the show!

While all of our Broadway, Pick 4, Silver Screen, and Children's Series were live and in-person, we opted to offer a mix of virtual and live performances for Valentine School Days. From September to December teachers and homeschool parents could access virtual performances free from our website. Starting in January, we offered live performances which included a moving rendition of "A Raisin in the Sun" by National Players, "I Have a Dream" by Virginia Rep, Ballet Theatre of Toledo's "The Little Mermaid, and "Charlotte's Web." In another COVID first, the very popular "The Pout Fish" was canceled because the entire cast tested positive the morning of the performance. Staff quickly called every school for the sold-out shows to alert them before students boarded their buses. We hope to reschedule "The Pout Pout Fish" for another VSD season.

In March we welcomed the incomparable Vanessa Williams to our stage for an intimate night of songs and stories for our annual Gala. Broadway pianist Seth Rudetsky of Siruis XM's "On Broadway" accompanied her as she sang many of her Broadway hits, including a beautiful rendition of "The Colors of the Wind" from Disney's "Pocohantas."

Finally, I would be remiss not to extend a sincere thank-you to the retired nurses who volunteered their time before every Broadway and Pick 4 show to administer COVID tests to union employees and all backstage crew. A sincere thank-you to Susan Beasecker, Anne Helm, Susan McCloud-Coyle, and Barbara Stengle (pictured at right).

The Toledo Cultural Arts Center at the Valentine Theatre is a 501(c)(3) notfor-profit, arts organization whose mission is to produce and provide cultural and performing arts experiences for diverse audiences of all ages, and to enhance the quality of the cultural and economic life of the City of Toledo, Lucas County, Northwestern Ohio, and Southeastern Michigan. All donations to the Valentine are tax-deductible.

Through Valentine School Days, Weekend Children's Series, and student performances by partner arts organizations, the Valentine enriches the lives of more than 15,000 children every year.

The Valentine Theatre opened Christmas Day 1895. Today it presents national touring productions of Broadway shows, award-winning musical artists, up-and-coming productions, and \$5 classic movies in its 900-seat Main Stage as well as locally produced plays, dramatic readings, and monthly improv shows in its 100-seat intimate Black Box Studio A.

The Valentine Theatre is the cultural hub of downtown Toledo, serving as the home stage for the Toledo Opera, Toledo Jazz Orchestra, Ballet Theatre of Toledo, and the venue of choice for the Toledo Symphony, Toledo Ballet, as well as area high schools and dozens of arts groups from throughout the region. Attendance is about 67,000 per year.

The Historic Valentine Theatre is also utilized as an event space. Its Grand Lobby, Historic Lobby, Founders Room, Studio A, and Main Theatre can host receptions, weddings, and corporate events.

- ♥ The Valentine Theatre received an \$8,000 grantfrom the Toledo Rotary Foundation to replace flooring in both the Founder's Room and the Sound Booth. The flooring upgrade in the Founder's Room is part of a larger effort to make the space more multi-purpose, including serving as a retreat space for patrons who are experiencing sensory overload.
- The Valentine staff filmed, edited and produced several new StoryTime episodes, highlighting Toledo's diversity. Our very own Ruth Kille read "Lunar New Year" and "I Dream of Popo," stories about Taiwanese culture. "Yo Soy Muslim," and "The Proudest Blue: A Story of Hijab and Family," were read by two local Muslim women. And, Valentine security officer and former Toledo Police woman, Berna Guy, read "Let's Meet a Police Officer."
- The Valentine Theatre was awarded a \$30,000 grant from the Ohio Development Agencies for COVID-related losses.
- ♥ The Valentine offered complimentary tickets and transportation assistance to 2,000+ lowincome students from Toledo Public Schools to attend Valentine School Days.
- Attendance at a Valentine Theatre performance or event was more than 33, 000, including more than 6,800 students.
- ♥ We hosted 78 performances on our Main Stage, 17 events, and our technical staff completely resurfaced the Main Stage theatre
- ♥ The Toledo Rep presented 8 performances of "The Legend of Georgia McBride" in Studio A.




History






Based on the calculator developed by the Americans for the Arts, the economic impact of the Valentine Theatre is significant.
